Attendance

Student Athlete/Activities Absence

1. A student participating in athletics or an activity, absent during any part of the school day, may not practice or play in a contest on that given day, unless approved by the activities director or building principal.

- a. There will be circumstances that allow a student to miss school and still participate. Those circumstances are handled on an individual basis by the activities director and building principal.
- 2. A student suspended from school will be ineligible to participate in any school-sponsored co-curricular and/or extra-curricular activities until the student is readmitted to school as a student in good-standing.

3. Unexcused absences my result in the suspension from one or more athletic contest, to be determined by the activities director and building principal.

Academic Integrity

•The handbook states:

 "All students have the responsibility to uphold the highest standards of academic and behavioral integrity in their own work. Work produced by students should represent their personal efforts and requires that they properly acknowledge the intellectual contributions of others. Academic Integrity includes, but is not limited to: <u>cheating</u>; <u>fabrication and</u> <u>falsification</u>; <u>multiple submissions</u>; <u>and plagiarism</u>.





Safe & Support School Act

Signed into State Law on April 9, 2014

1. The bill applies to student vs. student bullying. This is a student statute.

2. Traditional notions of school authority are maintained. Behavior that occurs at school, on buses or school events is covered. Electronic behavior that occurs off school premises but "substantially and materially disrupts" the school or "learning" can be disciplined as well. This is the same standard that has always been used regarding questions of "out of school" behavior. It has to have some impact what is happening at school. Same as before.

This definition sets an easy, workable standard for defining bullying.

Bullying falls into two categories:

(1)Bad behavior that involves an imbalance of power and pattern, or,

(2)bad behavior that significantly affects a student's ability to participate school, classes, or events.
