- → All third-graders can read at grade level.
- → All racial and economic achievement (opportunity) gaps between students are closed.
- → All students are ready for career and college.
- → All students graduate from high school.

### Goal 2: All Third-Graders can Read at Grade Level



In the FALL 2020, 52% of third grade students met fall literacy benchmarks as measured by FASTBRIDGE aReading assessments. In SPRING 2021, we will increase the percent of students meeting third grade benchmark assessments by 9 percentage points to 61%.

In the Fall 2020, 49.6% of third grade students met fall benchmarks as measured by FASTBRIDGE aReading assessments. In SPRING 2021, we had 56.2% meeting third grade benchmarks.

The students increased 6.6 percent.

❖ In the FALL 2021, 51.2% of third grade students met fall literacy benchmarks as measured by FASTBRIDGE aReading assessments. In SPRING 2022, we will increase the percent of students meeting third grade benchmark assessments by 6.8 percentage points to 58%.

The overall **District** four year graduation rate will increase from 74.9% in 2019 to 85% in 2020-21.

The percent of all students graduating from **Winona Senior High School** will increase 4.4% in 2020-21. The expected 2021 graduation rate will be 90.6%

The percent of students graduating from **Winona Area Learning Center** will increase 5.1% in 2020-21. The expected 2021 graduation rate will be 22.3%

The percent of students graduating from **WAPS District Wide** will increase 3.3 % in 2020-21. The expected 2021 graduation rate will be 81.8%
