Discussion of what that entailed: providing resources to waivers, grants, etc.; using SPED's agency list. Members/attendees/parents listed many different resource options for parents as possible helpful links: LiveWell Winona, Great River 211, Help Me Connect, etc. A parent brought up the concern of the amount of staff in the special education department leaving. Wondering if there is anything being done or any looking into this issue. Also parents/members discussed how communication with parents happened about this issue and others similar, whether or not it is adequate, and what are some ways it could be changed, improved, or at least commented upon by the public affected and/or interested.
