Overview of WAPS new Strategic Plan w/ Mission and Vision	<u>Information</u>	Dr. Knudsen passed out copies of the new WAPS district-wide strategic plan outline/goals. Briefly discussed questions about terminology (PBIS, MTSS, tier systems, "level/setting 3", etc). The following are specific questions raised and answered: Q: Regarding Goal #3 – how will the data collected be analyzed? Who will do the analysis? A: collection and analysis will be done in/by the school district; AVID program encompasses all those parts of the process.	Dr. Knudsen

		Not being implemented at the elementary level yet. Q: will PBIS still be used/part of this strategic plan? A: yes. Fully implemented at the middle school. Q: What are some examples of PBIS? A: 3-tiered intervention system. Tier 1: general education, Tier 2: kids needing more support/special ed, etc, etc. Creation of safe spaces, consistent/predictable environment, etc. Q: Is PBIS like MTSS? A: conceptually the same but different systems? PBIS: for behaviors, MTSS: for academics. The systems can be related/likened to how we do resource allocation. Q: Does Winona have a tier 3 space? A: yes. Clarifies terminology as "Setting 3", Yes, and in all areas of the district. Q: Re: Goal 7, how will this be done? A: The district has done book studies, professional development, use of a diversity framework/checklist for curriculum development/adoption and work practices, data analysis by subgroups like race/ethnicity, learning skills/disability, gender, etc. Working on culturally relevant learning practices across the district. Q: Is MTSS focused on mental health? A: includes everything, PBIS focuses on behavior, but MTSS encompasses that. Focuses on both kids and staff.
